BMC Metalworks expands precision machining services

BMC Metalworks has announced a new addition to its seven-acre facility. Now in its 43rd year of business, the company is introducing a new 3,000 square foot state-of-the-art CNC precision and high volume machining center.

The CNC precision machining area includes new machinery such as a CNC lathe with live tooling, parts catcher, and bar catcher with up to 3" bar capacity, a HAAS ST30Y CNC suited for high volume turning and turn parts which require additional milling and drilling that can be accomplished within the same setup, and a new coordinate measuring machine housed in a temperature controlled environment.

Other machines such as the fourth Axis HAAS 3YT and

HAAS VF8 have also been installed in the new addition to expand the machining services.

"The new CNC precision machining area augments BMC Metalworks' overall machining capabilities nicely," BMC's Machine Services Manager Michael Bowe said. "With the addition of a temperature controlled environment, closer tolerances can be maintained and confirmed. The highly productive equipment is state of the art and fully capable of producing a wide range of machined components from a variety of materials efficiently."

With the continued industrial and economic growth of Maury County, and the greater middle Tennessee area, BMC wanted to be able to provide more services for not only their

existing customers, but to all new businesses coming in to industrial areas.
